AN EXALTED KING: Psalm 110

P. I. T. W. M.

Psalm 110:1 The Lord said unto my Lord, Sit thou at my right hand, until I make thine enemies thy footstool.

The Lord Jehovah (*meaning everything that came into being came from the self-existent God who simply spoke and brought the universe into existence*), said unto Adonai (*refers to Lord, Master who expects obedience*), David's King, (*our Lord*), who is The Messiah. Christ is the perfect fulfillment of the Davidic covenant, and among His names are both Branch of David and Root of David.

Jehovah speaks directly to David's Master, and bids Him to sit at His right hand. This represents the third step in the exaltation. The first step in His exaltation was His Resurrection: the second step was His ascension into heaven. Now He's saying you have royal power, you have permanent

honor, an intimate posture, until I make your enemies Your footstool. Having completed His atoning work, the dominion of Christ over His enemies, as commissioned by God, all His enemies will be put under His feet.

110:2 The Lord shall send the rod of thy strength out of Zion: rule thou in the midst of thine enemies.

The custom of Eastern conquerors signifies a complete subjection, complete victory and superiority. He says the rod of Your strength will rule in the midst of Your enemies (an emblem of world dominion).

110:3 Thy people shall be willing in the day of thy power, in the beauties of holiness from the womb of the morning: thou hast the dew of thy youth.

And because of the power of the gospel and of His mighty hand, the servants of the Saviour will be willingly ruled by the Messiah. The people freely

offer themselves in the beauty of holiness because they were refreshed and strengthen like the dew of the morning.

110:4 The Lord hath sworn, and will not repent, Thou art a priest for ever after the order of Melchizedek.

In verse 4, Christ is the Eternal Priest, who has sworn and will not repent. The priestly Order of Melchizedek was different from the Levitical or the Aaronic Priesthood. The Melchizedek Order was eternal while the Aaronic Order was temporary.

110:5 The Lord at thy right hand shall strike through kings in the day of his wrath.

110:6 He shall judge among the heathen, he shall fill the

places with the dead bodies; he shall wound the heads over many countries.

Verses 5 and 6 predicts the triumph of the Messiah over the Antichrist and his followers. The eternal Messiah is the eternal Priest; the eternal

Priest is the eternal King; the eternal King is the eternal Judge; the eternal Judge is the eternal Lord! The Messiah's conquests are described, though His work and God's are the same.

110:7 He shall drink of the brook in the way: there-

fore shall he lift up the head.

As a conqueror, yet pursuing, He shall be refreshed by the brook in the way, and pursue to completion His divine and glorious triumphs. The attacks of Satan shall not cause the march of Christ to faint, nor fail. The lifting up of the head means that

Christ will be exalted over the nations of the world and as the only head, he will rule in Righteousness, Holiness, and Judgment. So let us not faint because the King must be exalted in our lives! God Bless!

AGING CHANGES IN HAIR AND NAILS

¹Your hair and nails help protect your body. They also keep the temperature of your body steady. As you age, your hair and nails begin to change.

Hair Changes and Their Effects

Hair color change— This is one of the clearest signs of aging. Hair color is due to a pigment called melanin, which hair follicles produce. Follicles are structures in the skin that make and grow hair. With aging, the follicles make less melanin, and this causes gray hair. Graying often begins in the 30s.

Scalp hair often starts graying at the temples and extends to the top of the scalp. Hair color becomes lighter, eventually turning white.

Body and facial hair also turn gray, but usually later than scalp hair. Hair in the armpit, chest, and pubic area may gray less or not at all.

Graying is largely determined by your genes. Gray hair tends to occur earlier in white people and later in Asians. Nutritional supplements, vitamins, and other products will not stop or decrease the rate of graying.

Hair thickness change—

Hair is made of many protein strands. A single hair has a normal life between 2 and 7 years. That hair then falls out and is replaced with a new hair. How much hair you have on your body and head is also determined by your genes.

Nearly everyone has some hair loss with aging. The rate of hair growth also slows.

Hair strands become smaller and have less pigment. So the thick, coarse hair of a young adult eventually becomes thin, fine, light-colored hair. Many hair follicles stop producing new hairs.

Men may start showing signs of baldness by the time they are 30 years old. Many men are nearly bald by age 60. A type of baldness related to the male hormone testosterone is called male-pattern baldness. Hair loss may be at the temples or at the top of the head.

Women can develop a similar type of baldness as they age. This is called female-pattern baldness. Hair becomes less dense and the scalp may become visible.

As you age, your body and face also lose hair.

Women's remaining facial hair may get coarser, especially on the chin and around the lips. Men may grow longer and coarser eyebrow, ear, and nose hair.

Contact your health care provider if you have sudden hair loss. This can be a symptom of a health problem.

Nail Changes and Their Effects

Your nails also change with age. They grow more slowly and may become dull and brittle. They may also become yellowed and opaque.

Nails, especially toenails, may become hard and thick. Ingrown toenails may be more common. The tips of the fingernails may break.

Lengthwise ridges may develop in the fingernails and toenails.

Check with your provider if your nails develop pits, ridges, lines, changes in shape, or other changes. These can be related to iron deficiency, kidney disease, and nutritional deficiencies.
